- Give For Good 2022 raised a record-breaking \$2.39 million from more than 4,500 donors through a total of 8,715 gifts.




# A Letter from the Chairman of the Board Glenn V. Kinsey



## **Total Grants by Program Area**

In 2022, CFNLA granted over **\$9.2 million** in grants and scholarships to **350 organizations** and **29 students**. Grants are awarded from a number of sources, including donor advised funds, the Competitive Grants process, scholarships, and Give For Good.

- **Unrestricted Funds** allow CFNLA the flexibility to address the community's most pressing needs as they change over time. From unrestricted funds, grants are made through the annual Competitive Grants process.
- Through **Donor Advised Funds**, donors work with the Foundation to recommend grants to nonprofit organizations they choose.
- **Field of Interest Funds** allow a donor to target a specific subject matter area such as arts, education or the environment.
- Donors create **Designated Funds** to benefit a particular nonprofit organization.



# Health & Science



# St. Luke's Episcopal Mobile Medical Ministry

St. Luke's reaches the medically underserved in rural and urban communities in NWLA. It provides preventive health care screenings for hypertension, diabetes, obesity and elevated cholesterol for early diagnosis and treatment. Diagnosed patients can be treated on the van and/or referred to other community resources for on-going care.

#### MLK Health Center & Pharmacy Healthy Families, Healthy Communities

MLK aims to improve the health of NWLA's medically vulnerable populations by providing a one-stop shop for free medical care, pharmacy services, and wellness education to uninsured or under-insured adults struggling with chronic health conditions.



#### YMCA of Northwest Louisiana Swim For Life

YMCA aims to prevent drownings through its four-day water safety and survival skills course for 2nd grade students in Caddo Parish. In 5 years of operation, more than 12,000 students have completed the Swim For Life course.



# The Bridge Alzheimer's & Dementia Resource Center

The Bridge provides a Comprehensive Support System for persons affected by Alzheimer's and Dementia and their caregivers in a one-stop-shop with wrap around services including resources, support services, education, and outreach to the community.





#### **LifeShare Blood Center**

LifeShare helps meet the area healthcare facilities' demand for skilled phlebotomists with its six week, 120 hour, Phlebotomy School program. Students gain knowledge of medical terminology, basic blood banking, and hands-on skill development.



## Human Services



#### Food Bank of Northwest Louisiana <u>Driving Out Hunger</u>

The Mobile Food Pantry increases food security and improves nutrition for individuals in rural Northwest Louisiana who live below the poverty level and in food deserts by providing delivery of fresh produce and healthy food approximately eight times per year.



# **Christian Service Program** *Hospitality House*

Christian Service provides critical basic needs for people in need and those experiencing homelessness. The Hospitality House serves two hot meals 364 days a year and provides free clothing and emergency financial assistance.



#### Gingerbread House Bossier/Caddo Children's Advocacy Center

The Child Advocacy Program serves as a comprehensive resource for children who have experienced sexual and severe physical abuse and victims of child sex trafficking. Through collaboration with law enforcement, child protective services, the district attorneys' offices, and medical and mental health professions, Gingerbread House provides cohesive support for child victims and non-offending caregivers throughout the investigation, prosecution, and healing process.



#### Shreveport Bar Foundation Pro Bono Project Legal Representation for Victims of Domestic Violence

Volunteer attorneys and paralegals represent domestic violence victims in court to help them gain protective orders against their abusers. Providing free legal advocacy lessens victims' stress and helps them create a safe living environment.



#### Providence House Breaking the Cycle of Homelessness

Providence House helps families experiencing homelessness achieve life-long self-sufficiency through comprehensive services including housing, education, employment services, financial literacy, and life skills.



# Caddo Council on Aging Meals on Wheels

The Meals on Wheels program ensures that seniors have access to adequate nutrition even when family support, mobility, and resources are lacking. The meals provided are 1/3 of the recommended daily allowance.

# The Strand Theatre of Shreveport Corporation Strand Presented

Downtown Shreveport's historical theatre presents touring Broadway musicals, comedy acts, and concerts to enrich lives and promote economic growth and positive change in Shreveport-Bossier.



# **Red River Revel** *Celebrating Louisiana Culture*

The Red River Revel unites our community and attracts visitors through its annual festival that showcases visual and performing arts. The nine-day festival serves over 25,000 students via three arts education programs.



#### Shreveport Metropolitan Ballet Chance to Dance

In partnership with Volunteers of America, SMB teaches classical ballet to 3rd through 5th grade students and gives them a chance to participate in an SMB performance.



As North Louisiana's only nonprofit, independent cinema, RFC seeks to enrich our community by providing access to educational programming and a diverse offering of films that deliver entertaining, yet transformative dialogues and experiences.



The Theater of Performing Arts seeks to foster and preserve the culture, arts, and history of African Americans through multidisciplinary arts programs for children, youth, and adults.

# Film Prize Foundation Elevating Creativity through Competition

Through six Prize initiatives- Film, Music, Food, Fashion, Startup, and Comedy- The Prize Foundation promotes economic growth, workforce development for adults and youth, and increases tourism through education, entrepreneurship, competitions, and festivals in Northwest Louisiana.

# **Economic Development**

North Louisiana Economic Development Identifying Assets and Attracting New Business

Through site identification, feasibility analysis, and development, NLEP attracts companies in targeted industries to bring jobs and capital investment to North Louisiana.



#### Goodwill Industries of North Louisiana Job Training and Placement

Goodwill Industries provides work readiness training, job placement, and retention services to reduce barriers to employment for individuals with limited education and work experience, criminal backgrounds, and people with disabilities.

#### **Education**



#### **Volunteers of America North Louisiana** Helping Students Succeed in School and in Life

Communities In Schools and The Lighthouse serve K-12 students who are most at-risk of academic failure, 95% of whom live in poverty, by connecting them to caring adults and community resources. Both programs provide academic, emotional, and social support for students aimed to increase their success in school, thereby reducing the dropout rate.

#### **Literacy Volunteers at Centenary College** Changing Lives through Literacy

Literacy Volunteers at Centenary College provides free in-person and online basic literacy, English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL), GED preparation, and Health Literacy training to individuals in Northwest Louisiana.





#### **Career Compass of Louisiana** Paving the Path to College and Beyond

Career Compass seeks to remove obstacles that prevent students from pursuing a post-secondary education through its partnership with Caddo and Bossier Parish public schools. The program provides 12th grade students with one-on-one college and career coaching. Coaches help students create an action plan for post-graduation, assist with college applications, identify scholarship opportunities, and complete the financial aid process.

#### **Volunteers for Youth Justice Reducing Truancy in Schools**

The TASC program provides early identification and coordinated interventions for Caddo Parish students in grades K-5 who have five or more unexcused absenses. TASC Officers connect families to resources that address their particular needs to allow them the opportunity to decrease absenteeism without court involvement.



CFNLA is committed to building a stronger future for this place we love and call home. It is through these partners and more that we work daily to create a community where everyone can thrive.

The nonprofit partners highlighted here are only a small selection of CFNLA Competitive Grantees and were chosen based on submissions from the organizations.



#### **Investments**

Several money management firms manage the Foundation's long-term pool portfolio, each having a specific role in the overall management process. These firms were chosen following a rigorous selection process conducted by the Foundation's Board of Directors and Investment Committee. The Foundation's investment consulting firm, Fund Evaluation Group, assists the Foundation's Board and Investment Committee in all asset manager selection and performance management issues for its long-term pool. In 2022, the long-term pool produced a -9.1% return against a policy index of -9.9%, net of all management fees. From September 1997 through December 2022, the long-term pool portfolio averaged 6.8% against a policy index of 6.2%.

As a member of the Finance, Investment, and Audit committees, Tom tracked CFNLA's assets very carefully throughout the years. "It has been extremely rewarding to see both the Foundation's assets and grantmaking double during my tenure", said Tom. "I think the board and staff accomplished a great deal, including a critical and very thoughtfully executed transition of leadership to Kristi when Paula Hickman retired. I leave extremely proud and confident in what lies ahead for the Foundation because of the committed and capable staff who operate with integrity and thoughtfulness in all they do."



#### Dr. Terry Davis

Terry's career and personal life have revolved around serving others and her community. From her early days as a mental health and addiction counselor to years as a behavioral scientist, professor of medicine, community volunteer, Terry has been devoted to creating equitable access to health care, education, and recreation. Through her research and advocacy in health literacy, she works to improve health outcomes for marginalized populations by educating physicians, nurses, and medical students on how social factors, particularly a person's education level and literacy, impacts their health. Before Terry joined the Board, she was a founding member of the Women's Philanthropy Network (WPN), CFNLA's women's giving circle focused on creating positive change in Shreveport through funding effective educational initiatives.

What Terry says she values most from her board service is gaining awareness and a deeper knowledge of the nonprofit organizations in the area. She enjoys connecting her medical students to volunteer opportunities and community engagement. According to Terry, "serving on the Community Foundation Board is tremendously rewarding. I appreciate being part of a group working collaboratively in the community to effectively improve health, education, economic development, and quality of life."

Terry is most proud of CFNLA's shift to more strategic grantmaking aimed at interrupting the cycle of poverty for children through education. Terry plans to continue serving on CFNLA's Competitive Grants LOI committee, the WPN, and hopes to be a resource for new and existing board members.
