

AMERICAN JOB CENTER PARTNER PROGRAMS

Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA)

Provides professional development needs of adult education and family literacy practitioners in Louisiana. BPCC and NLTC offers Assessments, Basic Skills Remediation: reading, writing, math up to College Ready, English as a Second Language, High School Equivalency (English and Spanish), Digital Literacy (Internet, Microsoft Office Programs, basic computer operations), and Job Skills/Training opportunities.

Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS)

► Strategies to Empower People (STEP): Provides opportunities for work – eligible families of FITAP to receive job training, employment, and supportive services to enable them to become self-sufficient.

► Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP): Provides monthly benefits that help eligible low-income households buy the food they need for good health.

► Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TNAF): Provides assistance to needy families with (or expecting) children and provides parents with job preparation, work, and support services to enable them to leave the program, specifically cash assistance, and become self-sufficient.

Carl D. Perkins

Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Technical Education is to develop more fully the academic, career, and technical skills of secondary education students and postsecondary education students who elect to enroll in career and technical education programs.

Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA)

WIOA Title I address the needs of job seekers who are adults, dislocated workers, and youth. Title I of WIOA seeks to provide universal access to employment and training programs through a nationwide network of one-stop centers administered through state and local WDB's.

Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP) – Project AYUDA

SCSEP Provides training opportunities for low-income seniors to refresh job skills and/or to learn new skills while allowing them to once again become productive members of our workforce and society.

Wagner-Peyser - Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC)

► Eligibility of services: All employers seeking workers and all individuals legally authorized to work in the United States and seeking work for any reason (regardless of current employment status).

► Services: Job search and placement assistance for job-seekers, including counseling, testing, occupation and labor market information, assessment, and referral to employers; Recruitment services and special technical services for employers, including assistance in analyzing hard-to-fill job orders, assisting with job restructuring, and assistance in dealing with layoffs; Reemployment services for UI claimants; Services for workers who have received notice of permanent or impending layoff; Development and provision of labor market and occupational information; Administration of the work test site for state unemployment compensation system.

Trade Adjustment Act - LWC

Includes both TAA and NAFTA services and benefits:

► TAA services and benefits apply to workers who have lost their jobs because of imports from any country.

► NAFTA services and benefits apply to workers who have lost their jobs because of imports from, or shift in production to, Mexico or Canada

**Note: Since NAFTA is a part of the TAA program, TAA is sometimes used to indicate both TAA and NAFTA services and benefits.*

Unemployment Insurance - LWC

UI benefits are paid as a matter of past employment and legal entitlement, and not on the basis of need. UI is a program designed to provide temporary financial assistance to workers who are unemployed through no fault of their own and meet all other eligibility requirements.

Motivation, Education, & Training, Inc. (MET): Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers Program

MET provides free academic and vocational training to migrant and seasonal farmworkers. The services offered by MET includes vocational skills training, occupational certifications, occupational licenses, customized training, job readiness skills training, work experience training, on the job training, computer literacy training, agricultural upgrade training, ESL training, pesticide safety training, and direct job placement.

Jobs for Veterans Program - LWC

Provides employment assistance and training opportunities to Veterans and other eligible persons, mainly job assistance, job and training referral, and job placement.

Shreveport Job Corps Center

Job Corps is a no-cost education and career technical training program administered by the U.S. Department of Labor that helps young people ages 16 to 24 improve the quality of their lives through career technical and academic training.

Vocational Rehabilitation Services

Program that provides services to help persons with disabilities obtain the job skills and other resources they need to get a job, keep a job, and develop a career.
