

APPRENTICESHIP OPPORTUNITY

The Shreveport Electrical Apprenticeship Program is a five-year program with classroom instruction and paid on-the-job training. Classes are nine months out of the year on Tuesday and Thursday nights starting at 5:00 p.m. for 2.5 hrs.

The program covers all phases of the electrical industry from conduit installation to instrumentation. On-the-job training starts around June 15 each year.

Applications will be taken Monday through Friday, year-round from 8:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. Applications will be taken at 1013-B Gould Dr., Bossier City.
